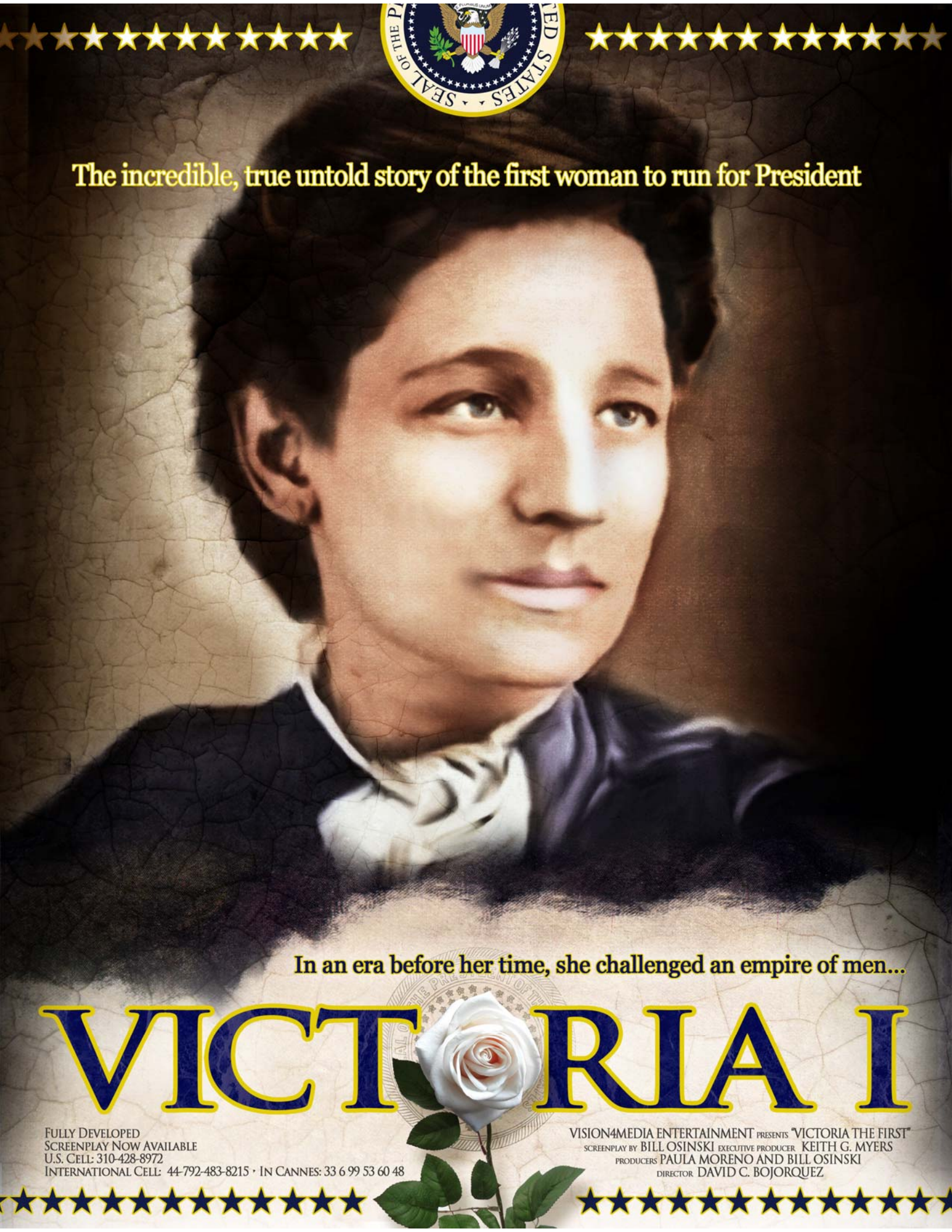

Victoria the First is the sweeping historic epic of a courageous 19th century woman who dared to challenge the world and become the first female candidate for President of the United States. This is the larger-than-life, true story of Victoria Woodhull - who rose from a family of frontier criminal rogues to become the first woman stock broker on Wall Street, the first woman to address Congress, and the first woman to challenge a system of misogynistic slavery, and run against Ulysses S. Grant for the highest office in the land.

As a child and teenager, Victoria traveled the Midwest with parents who were all too willing to compromise her integrity for their ill-gotten gain. As she grew Victoria leveraged her strength, poise, and wit along with an uncanny clairvoyant gift, to win the trust of the most powerful men of her era; and she attained a fortune doing so. When she hit New York not long after the Civil War, the nation was up for grabs – and Victoria wasn't about to let her gender limit her reach. She charmed the richest man in the nation with her beauty, and soon enthralled politicians, opinion makers and social reformers with her oratory.

Victoria Woodhull dared to declare herself a candidate for President 50 years before women could vote. She shot to the forefront of the suffrage movement. She exposed the sexual hypocrisy of the country's leading religious figure and scandalized the nation. She was adored as "The Bewitching Broker," and later reviled as "Mrs. Satan."

Victoria Claflin Woodhull was an orator, free-love advocate, faith-healer, spiritualist, progressive publisher, a powerful social justice advocate and pioneer suffragist who accomplished what no other woman in the late 19th century could even imagine.

Far ahead of her time, she made intimates and enemies of some of the best-known people of her era, including Commodore Cornelius Vanderbilt, Susan B. Anthony, Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Harriet Beecher Stowe, Henry Ward Beecher and President Ulysses S. Grant. Victoria Woodhull's life is the story of a radical visionary and leader so revolutionary - that she found herself even shunned by the most prominent in the American Suffragette movement. Victoria's life story is a story of an epic struggle. Ironically, over a century later her work still remains unfinished.

Given today's political realities, the timing for this motion picture couldn't be better.
